

Curbside, Virtual, Mobile and More

NVHC's COVID-19 response prioritizes safety and convenience for patients

NVHC continues to make a variety of healthcare options available to safely address the needs of our patients and communities.

Beginning in early March, NVHC implemented drive-up respiratory clinics at our Sierra (Carson City), Elko Family Medical and Dental (Elko) and Martin Luther King (Las Vegas) locations. With help from generous community partners, Jaguar Land Rover Las Vegas and Campagni Auto Group of Carson City, who donated large tents for our curbside staging areas; and CPR Tents & Events, who set-up and secured the tents, we have been able to ensure that patients and staff are sheltered from the elements while visiting us for curbside screening and testing.

NVHC also expanded capacity for our virtual care programs and deployed a direct-to-consumer telehealth program. This program allows us to provide services to patients anywhere via their connected smart devices or increase in utilization (more than 40%) of our virtual care programs and we are in the process of rolling out similar technology for dental visits.
